COVID-19 Policies and Procedures

- > Handwashing instruction and frequency
- ➤ Sanitizing stations
- ➤ Robust cleaning
- Masks worn in hallways, mixed cohorts, close contact, when asked, special circumstances (Saber Safety Kit)
- >Zoned recess and grade-level equipment
- >4 to a table at lunch
- >Staggered dismissal
- ➤ No parents or visitors past lobby
- >Limited volunteers in building
- ➤ No drinking fountains, bottle fill only
- ➤ Daily Remind to check for symptoms
- ➤ Quarantine Area for students/staff experiencing symptoms



HOW LONG MUST THEY STAY OUT OF SCHOOL?

When a student should stay home or may be sent home Page 1 of 2

Students should not go to school or any school activities or sports if having symptoms of COVID-19. If they start having symptoms of COVID-19 while at school, they will need to be sent home. They may return based on the guidance for their diagnosis (See "Managing Communicable Diseases in Schools") unless they are at risk for COVID-19 exposure.

As long as there are cases of COVID-19 in the community, there will be no way to prevent all risks of COVID-19 spread in schools. The goal is to keep the risk as low as possible and keep school and school activities as safe as possible.



If your child has been placed into isolation or quarantine for COVID-19, they may not attend school.

SYMPTOMS OF COVID-19 (CDC VERSION FOR K-12)

(If new, different, or worse than any longstanding conditions)

- Temperature 100.4 or signs of fever (chills/sweating)
- Sore throat
- New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain

New onset of severe headache IS YOUR CHILD AT RISK FOR EXPOSURE TO COVID-19?

Students are at higher risk for COVID-19 if in the past 14 days:

- Had close contact with a person with confirmed COVID-19
- Had close contact with person under guarantine for COVID-19
- Have a or has a history of international travel, or have been on a c an area with high levels of COVID-19 in the community (Risk Level www.mistartmap.info.

If "YES" to any questions in Section 1, and "NO" to all questions in Sec should stay out of school until they meet criteria for return based on t

If "YES" to any question in Section 1, and "YES" to any question in Sec should stay out of school, and be evaluated by their healthcare provi receive COVID-19 testing

If "NO" to all questions in Section 1, and "YES" to any questions in Section only be excluded from school if they have had close contact to someone COVID-19, as they should be in quarantine.

If you are asked to get a medical evaluation for your child, you may call your provider, or to follow up with a local clinic or urgent care center. You can also call 2-1-1 or go to www.mi.gov/coronavirustest to find the closest testing location. While testing is not required, students may need to be excluded from in-person instruction for a longer period of time.


Tutoring / Supervised Study


- · Will be scheduled on an as needed basis this year
